



Program Discharge Criteria

1. Clients meeting the following criteria will be discharged from the ***Residential Rehabilitation Program:***
 - a.) Achievement of outcomes and goals established by the team
 - b.) Demonstration of progress that allows for rehabilitative care to be completed or continued on an outpatient basis, such as home or community based, or other specialty programs as needed.

2. Clients meeting the following criteria will be discharged from the ***Residential Rehabilitation Program:***
 - a.) Deterioration or instability in a medical condition, or behaviors that are prohibiting progress creating an inability for the resident to participate in prescribed therapy services. An acute change in medical status, may warrant readmission to an acute care hospital.
 - b.) Demonstration of a plateau in progress as defined by a lack of documented progress in therapies.
 - c.) Request for discharge by physician, patient, or patient's family before goals have been met.
 - d.) A change in funding and/or non-payment
 - e.) Client passes away
